BUSINESS AND BIOTECH LEADERS PARTNER TO GROW LOS ANGELES AS GLOBAL LIFE SCIENCE HUB

CULVER CITY, Calif. (July 13, 2022) – Business think tank leaders are partnering with California's most powerful life science advocate to help realize the Greater Los Angeles region's potential to become a global hub for life science innovation. With proper infrastructure, investments and industry support, these efforts to #growLAbio will improve and prolong lives while growing jobs and bolstering livelihoods.

BizFed Institute and **Biocom California** are proud to co-host the first annual "**Greater L.A. Life Science Forum**" Thursday, July 14 at Bioscience LA in Culver City. The three-panel event will run from 11 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. followed by a networking reception to cement transformational partnerships between diverse industry leaders, elected officials and other attendees motivated to fuel an emerging economic engine.

Notable speakers and panel moderators include an impressive roster of influential innovators and conveners, each responsible for unique contributions to the growth of the life science industry or the health of the regional economy.

Panelists and presenters will discuss how private and public sector leaders can lean in to support local life science companies seeking to establish or expand their businesses; entice life science companies headquartered in other cities to relocate to L.A.; and accelerate efforts to meet local workforce needs such as housing and transportation.

The forum also aims to call attention to industry infrastructure needs. The Greater L.A. region has a 1.8% vacancy rate in wet lab and shared lab space, meaning demand is far outpacing supply. Missing opportunities to expand lab capacity, attract new job creators and retain homegrown talent could lead to the flight of this economic driver, as well as the life science industry's force-multiplying effect on local jobs growth and economic development.

In 2021, the life science industry employed nearly 100,000 people in L.A. County and generated \$60.8 billion in local economy activity, according to Biocom California's 2021 Economic Impact Report. Industry jobs have a median income of \$98,000, nearly three times the county's average income per capita of \$34,000, according to Census Bureau data.

"We're excited to partner with BizFed Institute on this forum highlighting the importance of strong ties between the life science industry and the broader business community," said **Stephanie Hsieh**, Executive Director of Biocom California's Los Angeles office. "Our 2021 Economic Impact Report found this industry has a multiplier effect of 85 cents for every \$1 generated in initial sales. The life science industry is at a tipping point in the L.A. region. We must forge partnerships that propel the industry forward to create good-paying jobs, enhance quality of life and ensure equitable opportunity for all Angelenos."

"This forum is among our newest and timeliest offerings, and we couldn't be more excited to track the real-life impacts of our intel-sharing efforts," said **Kevin Harbour**, President of BizFed Institute. "Attendees will walk away with actionable to-do's that leverage business resources to build life science opportunities that benefit us all. This is what we do — build bridges with information."

The **Greater L.A. Life Science Forum** comes on the heels of a county motion to inject more resources into supporting the life science industry. The L.A. County Board of Supervisors voted Tuesday to approve the motion by **Sup. Holly Mitchell** directing county departments to:

- Report back in 90 days with a "Life Science Cradle-to-Career" employment pipeline for underserved communities
- Develop a suite of financial incentives to support small life science companies, including tax incentives for start-up costs and hiring, business development services and customized workforce training
- Create a structure for tenant improvement funds to build out life science spaces and upgrade existing spaces for companies that hire locally
- Designate a "Life Sciences Ombudsperson" to triage and streamline jobs, and create an implementation plan
- Explore innovative approaches to zoning in industrial areas that incentivize the siting of life science companies (modeled after the San Diego Employment Mixed Use Zones)
- Resume good faith collaboration and negotiation with the Lundquist Institute at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center Campus to advance development of a biotechnology park that would incubate new companies.
